Social life in many boomtowns was a topsy-turvy mix of hard-bitten ramblers, the suddenly wealthy, and the professional drinkers and gamblers who followed the money. In many new towns, "respectable" female companionship was hard to come by, and men were far from their homes and families—if they had them at all. Women who were unwilling to, or forbidden from, working alongside men in frontier industries often resorted to prostitution to make ends meet. For some, it was a true profession, and they would travel from town to town as fortunes and fashions shifted. If they had money, they might set up a bawdy house of their own and manage other "red light ladies." For others, the line was more ambiguous. Did an impoverished woman who cultivated her friendship with a mine foreman count as a prostitute? Complicating the issue, the concept of marriage was often loosely interpreted in the old West to explain the relationships that could spring up on the edges of civilization. Nevertheless, prostitution was a part of the social fabric in most western towns. It was usually connected to lower class saloons or dance halls, where lonely men went to seek female companionship. Some women may have preferred the social freedom they gained from being a professional. Some were attracted by the excitement of the mining camps and cow towns and hoped to earn some money. If she was really lucky, she might meet a man and live a respectable life. Others viewed prostitution as one of the few professions where women had a chance of financial success.
