Acchiappafantasm*i* è un libro per chi pensa che letteratura e vita siano due parole per indicare la stessa cosa. Anzi. Soprattutto per chi pensa che la vita sia una delle più riuscite invenzioni della letteratura. Tra tuffi teatrali e reportage narrativi, ritratti linguistici e ossessioni cinematografiche, Giordano Meacci riscrive gli anni della sua vita etimologica di lettore trasformandoli in un vero e proprio «Canzoniere in prosa». Divertendosi a giocare con le forme differenti che li prevedono: tutti questi frammenti (legati tra loro da una sintassi che gli conferisce comunque una vita nuova) vogliono essere, anche, una lettera d'amore alla passione che regala la vita quando si presenta e rivela il suo vero nome. E così Giordano Bruno e Bob Dylan, Ettore Scola e Caterina da Siena, Omero e Rosa Balistreri convivono, tra le pagine, insieme con l'epopea dei Senzacarta e i blues che ci proteggono dalla paura agli incroci quando c'è il rischio di incontrare il diavolo. Perché la vita, per chi acchiappafantasm*i*, è scritta anche dall'incanto della musica, dalla magia lunare delle immagini in movimento, dalla sospensione ipnotica del teatro. E la letteratura - per quello che poi vorrà dire - è la forma che si dà alla lingua per fermare i fantasm*i* che ci hanno attraversato e ci attraversano; aiutandoli a restare: e ad accompagnarci. Ma solo se vinti dall'azzardo di Bellezza che li tiene con noi.

Aftermath - Susan J. Brison 2023-01-03

A powerful personal narrative of recovery and an illuminating philosophical exploration of trauma On July 4, 1990, while on a morning walk in southern France, Susan Brison was attacked from behind, severely beaten, sexually assaulted, strangled to unconsciousness, and left for dead. She survived, but her world was destroyed. Her training as a philosopher could not help her make sense of things, and many of her fundamental assumptions about the nature of the self and the world it inhabits were shattered. At once a personal narrative of recovery and a philosophical exploration of trauma, this bravely and beautifully written book examines the undoing and remaking of a self in the aftermath of violence. It explores, from an interdisciplinary perspective, memory and truth, identity and self, autonomy and community. It offers imaginative access to the experience of a

rape survivor as well as a reflective critique of a society in which women routinely fear and suffer sexual violence. As Brison observes, trauma disrupts memory, severs past from present, and incapacitates the ability to envision a future. Yet the act of bearing witness, she argues, facilitates recovery by integrating the experience into the survivor's life's story. She also argues for the importance, as well as the hazards, of using first-person narratives in understanding not only trauma, but also larger philosophical questions about what we can know and how we should live.
